Monday, May 12th 10am-1pm Tuesday, May 13th 10am-1pm Location: Bear Paw

REQUIREMENTS:

Quilt MUST have a sleeve opening of 4" or bigger

Quilt MUST have a label on the bottom RIGHT side of BACK of quilt (See diagram below)

Label MUST, at least, have the quilt name and your name

Label MAY be temporary (pinned on, on paper, etc...)

MAXIMUM OF 3 QUILTS PER MEMBER



SLEEVE -- 4" OR BIGGER

BACK OF QUILT

LABEL

OTHER DATES TO REMEMBER

Online Quilt Entry will be open from April 1st to April 25th
