### **MASK DISTRIBUTION**

SMQA collected and distributed more than 800 masks between April 1st and May 1st. This is an amazing achievement and a testament to the Sierra Mountain Quilters Association's commitment to our community. Among the recipients of our masks are:

This is in addition to what our members and friends are doing individually. There have been at least another 300 masks distributed directly by our members to places such as Kaiser Fresno, Fresno Community Health, Madera Community Hospital, Community Medical Center in Madera, Red Cross staff, YLP and North Fork Fire Departments, and the CHP. And even that number does not begin to take into account the donations to family, friends, neighbors, church families, and relatives in other areas of the state and the country.



It is so rewarding to see our association take action to help our community with this incredible response.

Our friends and colleagues in Mariposa have also been busy. The Piece Makers have been busy distributing masks to Marisposa County Employees and the John C. Fremont Hospital, among other recipients. At last report, they had donated more than 200 masks in their community.
