#### Sierra Mountain Quilters Association General Membership Meeting Minutes July 8, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Penni Simily at the Oakhurst Community Center, and she led in the flag salute. There were 42 members present, and Zoom was available. Penni welcomed the members, July birthdays and anniversaries were acknowledged.

Susan Campbell made a motion, seconded by Patty Cramer, to accept the June 3, 2021, minutes as printed in the Newsletter. The motion carried. The May Treasurer's Report was accepted as published in the June newsletter and filed for audit.

Laura Gonzalez/First Vice-President, announced the following program schedule and availability to sign up for classes: August/ice dyeing with Janet Morita; September/strip poker; October/Seminole piecing with Rachel Clark; November/Grand Convergence Quilt with John Egbert; December/Christmas party; and January 2022/cuddle quilts. They are working on new programs for next year.

Teri De La Torre/Membership, reported on the members and guests that were present; held the raffle drawings; and announced that signups are available for the Fall Retreat to be held September 13-16, 2021, at ECCO; with payment being due at the August meeting.

Maria Ciccarelli/Second Vice-President, promoted the positivity challenge. They are looking at the possibility of a shop hop trip later in the year. Sally Walker/Webmaster and Mystery Quilt – no new information. Patty Cramer provided an update on the distribution of charity items, and she thanked everyone for their contributions – almost 400 items have been distributed. Kits for items are available at Bear Paw Quilts, pillow forms are also available and quilt tops are available for quilting., There is a donated kit with pattern and fabric for a quilt – it was suggested that this might be used for the opportunity quilt. Constance Peterson/Librarian, advised of library books that are available to check out, and of free books.

Old Business: Susan Campbell expressed appreciation for the list of quilting abbreviations that were printed in the newsletter from the trivia game at the last meeting.

New Business: Penni Simily said she sent emails to the heads of the circles asking members to think about taking an officer position. She will have a nominating committee for August. Lynn Gray has agreed to be Historian; Sue Johnson agreed to take over membership; and Constance Peterson has agreed to serve a co-chair of the Quilt Show. Penni noted that we need to be thinking about a quilt pattern for the opportunity quilt. Constance has one that she will forward to Penni. Constance asked those who had agreed to help with the 2021 Quilt Show to let her know if they would be willing to help with the next show. Penni asked for thoughts and prayers for Peggy McKnelly as she deals with serious health issues.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:20 p.m. Show and Tell and the ice cream social was held. The next meeting will be on August 5, 2021.

# As we were saying, there are a lot of choices to make when quilting:

**Showstopper or Supporting Role?** Take a look at your quilt. Do you want the quilting to add significantly to your quilt's design? Do you want the piecing and fabric to be the focus? The quilting design you choose can be subtle or dramatic; thread color that either blends or contrasts is another consideration.

**Motif or Not?** Are you making a Christmas quilt? Try a poinsettia design. A wildlife quilt may call for leaves or trees. Or a non-specific design with loops or swirls may be better for your quilt.

A Little or a Lot? Looser quilting allows the loft of the batting to remain full or works well with wool batting and has a more casual look. Dense quilting can look more modern and sophisticated. Remember the limits of your batting when deciding how far apart to quilt.

#### Soft and Graceful? Sharp and Energetic?

Quilting designs have their own personality. Check out the curves and the points. Lots of points add energy and excitement to a quilt. A design with plenty of curves has a soft look.

#### **Tips and Hints**

Square up your blocks at the earliest point when assembling a quilt.

Sounds like a no brainer, right? But sometimes the easiest tips make the biggest difference. If you square up your blocks immediately, you won't run into problems later. Ensure that your blocks are the same size by using your quilting ruler at every point of quilt construction.
