## March 4th Meeting

The March 4th meeting features Linda Wagner with "Edgy", a presentation on borders and binding.

One definition of edgy is having an intense or sharp quality. Linda advises not to settle for the quick and dirty. A little extra piecing can create tremendous attention getting results.

Borders: plain or pieced. What will give your quilt the best possible visual impact and how do you decide? Inner borders, outer borders, and binding all provide opportunity to add a little to the finished product. Borders can just be there, or they can be what defines your quilt and gives it real visual impacts. Linda's presentation will demonstrate options you have as a quilter and artist, along with decision-making possibilities and how to make it fit.

Linda has been quilting for more than 35 years and teaching for 25 years. Her personal interests gravitate to scrappy quilts. You can see more about Linda and her work on her website at [addquilter.com](http://addquilter.com).

February 4, 2021**

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Penni Simily. There were 33 members present on Zoom. Penni welcomed the members. Mel Peters made a motion, seconded by Laura Gonzalez, to accept the January 7, 2021, minutes as printed in the February newsletter. The motion carried. The January Treasurer's Report was accepted as published in the February newsletter and filed for audit.

Helen Brown, First Vice President, introduced the Material Girlfriends and their presentation on "Overcoming Quilting Disasters" this evening; they will do a workshop via Zoom on Friday and Saturday on the Confetti Star quilt.

Rhonda Lloyd stated she will be working with others to go through Donna Henning's quilts. Lin Crow has offered storage, and items will be available to the Guild at a later date.

Recess for the program at 6:12 p.m. with Lisa Norton and Lora Zmak, Material Girlfriends, giving their presentation.

Business meeting resumed at 7:15 p.m. Helen Brown reported that Linda Wagner will give a presentation on bindings and borders at the March 4<sup>th</sup> meeting. Patty Cramer and Maria Ciccarelli, Second Vice Presidents, announced that they are working on a wall hanging positivity challenge, to be smaller than 16 inches square and due at the August meeting.

Teri De La Torre, Membership, reported that there are 69 paid members, and she asked that dues be sent to the PO Box.

Sally Walker stated she updated the website to make the mystery quilt clues printable.

Patty Cramer advised of the distribution of heart pillows and cuddle quilts. They are working on a new project to provide baby bibs to Helping Hands. Kits for donation items are available at Bear Paw Quilts.

Constance Peterson, Librarian, noted that she is willing to meet members to check out library books. The titles of the books that are available will be listed on the website. Rhonda Lloyd noted that she is cleaning out her sewing room and will have books to donate to the Library.

Kathy Millhollon reminded members that the Quilt Show will not be held this year, but the opportunity quilt will still be raffled off. She urged members to sell tickets and they are due by May 10<sup>th</sup>.

Margie Williams announced that there will not be a spring retreat this year, it has been rescheduled for the second week in March 2022.

Betsy Anne Youngholm, Newsletter, reported that the Board discussed honoring Donna Henning by naming the scholarship after her. She has asked Rhonda Lloyd to help write something for the newsletter and to go out with the scholarship information.

Penni Simily announced that the Foothill Quilt Group is holding a virtual quilt show during the month of April. Betsy Anne will include information in the newsletter.

Show and Tell was held.

## SMQA Scholarship Named for Donna Henning

Donna was a much-loved member of our mountain area community of quilters. She was a tireless mentor and teacher for new and experienced quilters and all those in between. Donna loved color, fabric, quilting, appliqué, and embroidery, and was always happy to share her enthusiasm and expertise. She was extraordinarily patient as a teacher and would always take the time to consult on quilt design. She was a source for all things quilting for many of us. As the owner of Bear Paw Quilts and More, Donna was a generous supporter of the Sierra Mountain Quilters Association.

Before moving to the mountain area, Donna worked as a court reporter in Simi Valley. She spent most of her spare time doing needlework and quilting. Her true passion was quilting as seen in all the beautiful quilts she created.

Her parents brought the family to Bass Lake every year for vacation. They often stayed in the cabins at the old Pines Resort and enjoyed camping in the forest. One of Donna's favorite places was Willow Creek on the north side of the lake. In the late 1980's, Donna bought a small condo in Oakhurst and found herself coming up more and more often. She finally decided to move here full time. Her family soon followed her, buying a home in Yosemite Lakes Park.

After moving to Oakhurst, she went to work for Arlene's Quilt Shop. When Arlene decided to close her business, Donna thought this would be the perfect opportunity to start her own shop. She had recently become friends with Bonnie McClintock, and they decided to open a shop together. They opened "Bear Paw Quilts and More" in the Junction Plaza shopping center during the Fourth of July weekend, 1999.

Several years later, they found they needed more space to accommodate workshops and *more fabric*, moving to the current location.

There were many local quilters who were lucky enough to work with Donna over the years, adding their own specialized skills to the whole quilt shop experience.

Bear Paw participated in many Shop Hops and was a frequent stop for quilting enthusiasts traveling through Oakhurst on their way to Bass Lake and Yosemite. Her customers were very supportive of Donna and Bear Paw, especially during her illness. They always left with a bit of fabric and special prayers for her. She will be sorely missed.

We acknowledge and honor Donna's life, friendship and enthusiasm for fabric, design, and color, by naming the SMQA annual student scholarship for her.


