SUNBONNET SUE QUILT

My grandmother, Henry Payne, appliquéd and hand embroidered 32 Sunbonnet Sue blocks and around 1973 gave them to me to "someday" make into a quilt. I was told the appliqué pieces were taken from the play clothes my mother made for me when I was a child. Grandmother, an avid baker, had given my mother used flour sacks as an inexpensive way to learn to sew as she made her children's play clothes. I was determined to be as authentic as possible to my grandmother. As a result, I collected as many flour sacks as I could find to make the star blocks in the quilt. Since flour sacks are limited and hard to find I had to supplement the stars with cotton fabric that looked as close as possible to the typical flour sack patterns. It took me many years to collect the fabrics, piece the blocks and finally put the quilt together. My grandmother also hand quilted her quilts so I was compelled to hand quilt the quilt. As a real novice, this was my first attempt to hand quilt. It took me over a year and a half to complete the hand quilting. It probably is not as well done as my grandmother would have done, but I am sure she would be proud of me for what I accomplished.

Since my grandmother gave me enough blocks to make two quilts, I have made one for each of my daughters so they both will have a keepsake from their Grangran, Magaw, and mother. The quilt process began by collecting fabric starting in 2005, then pieced, quilted and finally completed in 2025.
