What are cuddle quilts and why do we make them? Cuddle quilts provide comfort to a wide variety of people at many different organizations. Cuddle quilts are usually about 39" X 45". We also make isolette covers, pillowcases, wheelchair bags, heart pillows, bibs, and belly bands. Each item is greatly appreciated by the recipients. Its pretty much our only effort to help our community and maintain our non-profit charitable organization status.

Thanks to all the ladies that helped with the Cuddle Quilt workday. We cut out about 80 pillowcases and a dozen heart pillows. There was also a lot of fun and laughter. Our next workday will not be until Wednesday, January 18, 2023. We will not be having a workday in December due to all our busy schedules this time of the year.



Kits are available at Bear Paw and at our monthly meetings. Stop by and pick up some. I am continuing to use the reward cards. Make sure you have your card stamped when you turn in a project. Each cuddle quilt earns a stamp. However, it takes 6 pillowcases, heart pillows, or wheelchair bags for each stamp. Once you have 5 stamps, you get a free spool of Aurifil thread or an Endurance Rotary cutter blade.

FEATURED QUILTING CIRCLE OAKHURST MACHINE EMBROIDERY CIRCLE

Oakhurst Machine Embroidery Circle (OMEC) is glad to be welcomed into SMQA as a "circle." The group was started in the dawn of time (any time before the COVID struck) as a sewing group hosted by Ruthi Conner in her home. At the group's beginnings, the ladies sewed and learned from each other such intricacies as bound buttonholes and blind hems by machine but mostly gathered to sew and chat. It morphed into a group interested in Machine Embroidery as the availability of the technology for home sewing machines evolved.

In 2009, the group moved to Bear Paw Quilts & More. The first machine embroidery project was greeting cards. Though the group continues to focus on machine embroidery, the unwieldiness of the massive machines and their embroidery units make it difficult to have projects where the members can all use their machines. So, we have evolved again to have demonstrations at the meeting, and sew projects that can be embroidered at home. The meetings are held on the fourth Monday of the month at 10:00 AM. at Bear Paw Quilts & More.

Our last project was an iron caddy that folds out into a small pad for ironing at your machine when taking your iron to classes. In November's meeting, Ruthi will be demonstrating making a hanging holder for the stabilizers used in machine embroidery with the types of stabilizers embroidered on each pocket. All are welcome.

Tarantula Festival

The Opportunity Quilt was displayed at the Tarantula Festival held in Oakhurst over the Halloween weekend. People used the booth as a pass through between the aisles which gave Bev the opportunity to engage them in conversation as they did so.
