



Materials & Cutting Instructions

Yields 2 blocks.

 Cottage Garden Lavender Fabric 3 17180 60	From ½ yard, cut: 2 - 6 ½" x WOF strips, cut into A: 8 - 6 ½" x 6 ½" 
 Foliage Aquamarine Fabric 9 17185 24	From ½ yard, cut: 3 - 3 ½" x WOF strips, cut into B: 16 - 3 ½" x 6 ½" 
 Foliage Lilac Fabric 11 17185 62	From ½ yard, cut: 1 - 6 ½" x WOF strip, cut into C: 8 - 6 ½" x 3 ½"  1 - 3 ½" x WOF strip, cut into D: 8 - 3 ½" x 3 ½" 
 Garden Gate Cobalt Fabric 13 17186 50	From ½ yard, cut: 1 - 6 ½" x WOF strip, cut into E: 2 - 6 ½" x 6 ½"  1 - 3 ½" x WOF strip, cut into F: 8 - 3 ½" x 3 ½" 
 Garden Gate Lilac Fabric 14 17186 62	From ½ yard, cut: 1 - 6 ½" x WOF strip, cut into G: 8 - 6 ½" x 3 ½"  2 - 3 ½" x WOF strips, cut into H: 16 - 3 ½" x 3 ½" 
 Filagree Cloud Fabric 16 13521 08	From ⅞ yard, cut: 1 - 6 ½" x WOF strip, cut into I: 8 - 6 ½" x 3 ½"  6 - 3 ½" x WOF strips, cut into J: 64 - 3 ½" x 3 ½"

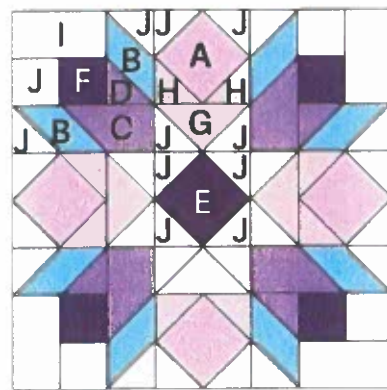

Block 9 Piecing Instructions

Yields 2 blocks.

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ "-wide seam allowances. Press after each seam. Pressing suggestions are indicated by the arrows in the assembly diagrams.

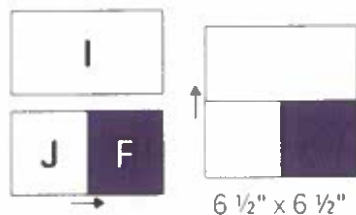

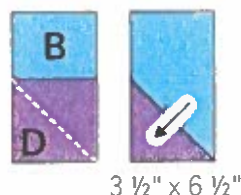
Part 1: Assembling the Corner Units

1. Sew an F square to the right edge of a J square. Then, sew an I rectangle to the top edge. **Make 8.**
2. Sew a D square to the lower left corner of a B rectangle. **Make 8.**
3. Join B and C rectangles to make a left-leaning rectangle unit. **Make 8.**
4. Sew a Step 2 unit to the right edge of a Step 1 unit. Then, sew a Step 3 unit to the bottom edge. **Make 8.**
5. Sew J squares to the upper right and lower left corners of a Step 4 unit. **Make 8.**

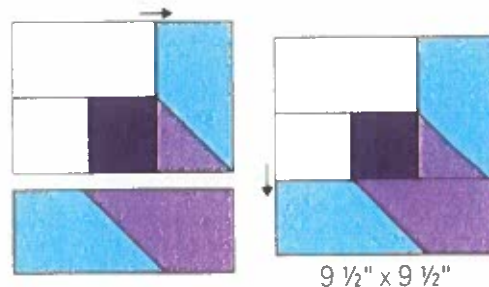
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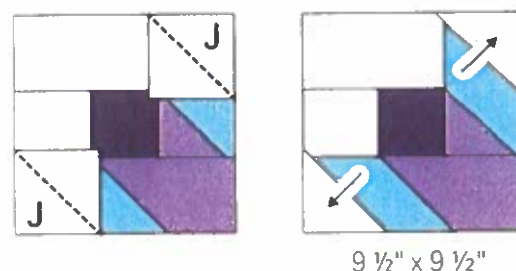
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Block 9 Piecing Instructions, Continued

Part 2: Assembling the Side Units

6. Sew J squares to the left and right ends of a G rectangle to make a flying geese unit. **Make 8.**
7. Sew H squares to the top corners and J squares to the bottom corners of an A square, as shown, to make a square-in-a-square unit. **Make 8.**
8. Join units from Steps 5-6 into pairs, as shown. **Make 8.**

Part 3: Assembling the Center Units

9. Sew J squares to the corners of an E square, as shown, to make a square-in-a-square unit. **Make 2.**

Part 4: Assembling Block 9

10. Arrange the units from Parts 1-3 in 3 rows as shown.

Sew the units together into rows and then join the rows together. **Make 2.**
