SMQA Community Education and Outreach

Quilting has been a part of American living since our country began. Girls and young women practiced perfecting their skills as we have seen through antique quilts in shows and museums. Quilting is becoming a lost art; today's young people may not know how to sew and may not have the opportunity to learn. Our generation was fortunate in that either our mothers and grandmothers sewed and taught us, or we were able to learn in a yearlong class at school. In our area, there is typically not a home economics program in schools that teaches the basics of sewing to young men and women.

That is where you can help promote the art of quilting.

Our outreach goals are:

1. To educate youth on the history of quilts, skills of sewing, fabric, design, and elements of art.

2. To encourage and mentor a student to create her/his own quilt to enter a SMQA sponsored competition which will ultimately be displayed at the 2021 Quilt Show.

3. To help students become eligible for the annual SMQA scholarship.

4. To further the community outreach portion of the SMQA mission to educate the public in general of artistic, handcrafted quilted projects.

Mentors must be able to communicate with students and parents, set up meeting times for sewing lessons, and be committed to a completed project. Having a basic machine for beginners is helpful but the guild may be able to provide one if needed. Bear Paw will graciously provide space in their workroom for tutoring sessions, but you must sign up on their schedule calendar.
