General Meeting, May 5, 2016

President Chris Hudson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. at the Oakhurst Community Center. Chris welcomed everyone and led the flag salute. Chris thanked tonight's greeters Sally Walker and Margie Williams and noted there is a sign-up sheet for future meetings. Birthdays and anniversaries were acknowledged and thanked them for bringing refreshments for the meeting. She thanked Rhonda Dewey for setting-up for the refreshments and Sue Graham/Gift Works for the flowers. She also recognized Becky Smith, Mel Peters, and Dianne Archibald for their milestone wedding anniversaries in May.

#### Approval of Minutes from Previous Meeting:

The General Meeting Minutes for April 7, 2016, were approved with a correction. Betsy Anne Youngholm noted the cuddle quilt sewing sessions are scheduled for May 17 and June 21 at Bear Paw, 10:30 - 12:30. Motion by Shirley Flynn and seconded by Chris Hartesveldt. Motion passed.

#### Reports:

- Chris Hudson announced that Amy Blodgett resigned from Membership Co-Chair and that Helen Brown accepted the position. She also announced that Becky Smith is resigning as Quilt Show Co-Chair and she is looking for someone to fill this position. Becky Smith provided input on the duties of the position and stated she is willing to help in the background.
- Betsy Blum, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, advised of a change in the August 5<sup>th</sup> workshop with Lisa McKissick from "Chic Kisses" to "Metro Twist" using a quick curve ruler. Sign-ups are being taken now. There are still eight spaces for the June 3<sup>rd</sup> workshop by Charlotte Rogers on "color." She advised that someone left a pattern piece at the last workshop by Kevin Kosbab. She thanked Rhonda Dewey for helping with hostess duties and noted there is a sign-up sheet to help with refreshments at future meetings.
- Trudy Kinsel, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President, held the drawing for the appliqué mini quilt challenge; she noted that the theme for June is "make a splash" and for July is "red/white/blue" and advised of a contest being held by sergedesigns.com for this theme. She also noted that bookmarks are available with information on other quilt shows.
- Betsy Anne Youngholm, Cuddle Quilt Chair and Fall Retreat Chair, cuddle quilt kits are available. There will be a sewing session at Bear Paw on May 17 and June 21 from 10:30 am to 12:30 pm for the cuddle quilts. She distributed 24 cuddle quilts Valley Children's Hospital, Oakhurst Wellness Center and Mariposa Mountain Crisis. She thanked the new members for turning in quilts. She noted that a new circle is starting on May 15<sup>th</sup> from 10 am to noon; the contact is herself or Amy Blodgett. She is ready to take sign-ups for the fall retreat which will be held September 19 22, day time only.
- Jean Richter/Librarian advised of the donation of books to the library.
- The Treasurer's report for March 2016 was approved as printed in the Newsletter and filed for audit. Charlotte Hickman advised that no one applied for a scholarship this year. Chris Hudson noted that Sharon Cox/Treasurer suggested that the funds be used for members to take classes and/or for a member to attend a professional class and come back and teach a class to the Guild.
- Chris Hudson advised of the receipt of a \$50 gift certificate to Second Chance Fabrics. Drawings were held for the certificate, a sewing theme puzzle donated by Sue Collins and the raffle/door prizes. It was noted that there are membership directories that still need to be picked up. Jullie Vasquez/Membership noted there are 52 members present.
- Laura Ashley-Spencer, Quilt Show Ticket Sales, stated \$973 in raffle tickets have been sold to date. Raffle tickets are available at Bear Paw. She asked that if money is left for the tickets that she be notified so she can pick it up. Rhonda Lloyd advised of the raffle tickets sold at the Best of the Valley Show/\$259, Rusty Barn/\$195 and Bear Paw Shop Hop/\$34; with a total to date of \$1020 for showing the opportunity quilt. Volunteers are needed for upcoming shows Quilters Paradise, etc.
- Charlotte Hickman asked the members and circles to start thinking about things they could make for the country store at the Quilt Show.
- Marilyn Harvey advised that a new circle is meeting in Mariposa on the last Wednesday of this month and she is the contact.
- Sally Walker, Webmaster-Mystery Quilt, noted that further clues and sewing instructions are available for the Mystery Quilt and she held a drawing.

#### New Business:

Chris Hudson noted that Bev Gordon from the Bear Club is present with the bear quilt made by the Footloose Circle and that raffle tickets are available. A drawing will be held later in the meeting for a bear quilt bag filled with goodies.

Mel Peters noted a letter was previously received from Tara Locks about moving back, and she asked if anyone had heard anything. Donna Henning stated she heard it may be another year before the move.

Show and Tell was held. The meeting was recessed at 6:54 p.m. followed by refreshments and a drawing for the Bear Club quilt bag. The meeting was adjourned at 7:17 p.m. followed by the Footloose Circle group presentation.

June's birth flower is the **rose** which has more meanings than one can count! A pink rose means



perfect happiness, while a red rose means "I love you." A white rose signifies innocence and purity, while a yellow rose conveys jealousy or a decrease in love. A bouquet of roses means sincere gratitude, whereas a

single roe amplifies the meaning of the color (a single red rose means " I REALLY love you"). The other June flower is **honeysuckle**, which is a strong symbol for the everlasting bonds of love.

# **Cuddle Corner**



### **Flag Day**

**Date When Celebrated:** Always June 14<sup>th.</sup> Flag Day is a day for all Americans to celebrate and show respect for our flag, its designers and makers. Our flag is representative of our independence and our unity as a nation...one nation, under God, indivisible. Our flag has a proud and glorious history. It was at the lead of every battle fought by Americans. Many people have died protecting it. It



even stands proudly on the surface of the moon.

As Americans, we have every right to be proud of our culture, our nation, and our flag. So raise the flag today and every day with pride!

**Properly Display Our Flag:** Care and handling of the American flag is steeped in tradition and respect. There is a right way and a wrong way to display the flag. This is called **Flag Etiquette**. The American flag should be held in the highest of regards. It represents our nation and the many people who gave their lives for our country and our flag. Here are the basics on displaying the American flag:

- The flag is normally flown from sunrise to sunset.
- In the morning, raise the flag briskly. At sunset, lower it slowly. Always, raise and lower it ceremoniously.
- The flag should not be flown at night without a light on it.
- The flag should not be flown in the rain or inclement weather.
- After a tragedy or death, the flag is flown at half staff for 30 days. It's called "half staff" on land and "half mast" on a ship.
- When flown vertically on a pole, the stars and blue field, or "union", is at the top and at the end of the pole (away from your house).
- The American flag is always flown at the top of the pole. Your state flag and other flags fly below it.

- The union is always on top. When displayed in print, the stars and blue field are always on the left.
- Never let your flag touch the ground, never...period.
- Fold your flag when storing. Don't just stuff it in a drawer or box.
- When your flag is old and has seen better days, it is time to retire it. Old flags should be burned or buried. Please do not throw it in the trash.

**Did you know?** There is a very special ceremony for retiring the flag by burning it. It is a ceremony everyone should see. Your local Boy Scout group knows the proper ceremony and performs it on a regular basis. If you have an old flag, give it to them. And, attend the ceremony.

#### Famous Flag People:

**Betsy Ross** was a seamstress who made clothes for George Washington. In June, 1776, Washington approached her to make the country's first flag and the rest is history.

**Francis Scott Key** Inspired by the British bombardment of Fort McHenry, Francis Scott Key penned the lyrics to our national anthem as he witnessed the event as British rockets whizzed in the air while our American Flag flew in the breeze.

**Did you know?** If you like to study flags, then you are a Vexillologist!
