CUDDLE CORNER

Because the January meeting was cancelled, we will be sewing Cuddle Quilts during the February meeting. Four of our members are bringing machines to the February meeting ready to start stitching up some tops. If you are attending and able to bring a sewing machine, we'll be able to get that much more accomplished. Those of you bringing your machines, please bring your sewing basics (thread, pins, scissors, rotary cutters). We'll have tables set up with cutting mats and irons. In the past it seems to work well with one person sewing with three or four ladies pinning and pressing. There will be plenty of fabrics/batting/ backing and binding to work with. If you aren't able to finish, we ask that one of your "team" members takes the project home, completes it, bringing it back to the next meeting. There will also be kits for you to take home, finish and bring back.

Bear Paw Quilts will continue to have some kits available in their back room. We're asking that any finished items be brought to the monthly meetings, or send them back with one of your quilting buddies. We will continue using the "stamp" cards where you get a card stamped for items you complete. Once your card is completely stamped, you get a free spool of thread. QUILT SHOW COMMITTEE

CHAIRS AND VOLUNTEER HELPERS NEEDED

- Co-Chair to work with Constance Peterson
- Clean-up Chair: Schedules volunteers to help clean up after the quilt show.
- Country Store Chair: Collects donated items to sell at the show and schedules volunteers to work in the store.
- Entry Table Chair: Orders wrist bands and badges for volunteers, sets up entry table, and schedules volunteers to greet and collect entry money from attendees.
- White Glove Chair: Launderers white gloves and aprons and schedules volunteers to work shifts during the show.
- Publicity Chair: Handles all publicity associated with the quilt show, including newspaper articles, flyers, etc.
- Kitchen Chair: Picks up pizza Friday for set up crew, hires a vendor to provide meals for lunch Saturday and Sunday, and purchases snacks to sell during the day.
- Opportunity Quilt Scheduling Co-Chairs: Sets up venues and schedules volunteers to sell Opportunity Quilt tickets.
- Opportunity Quilt Ticket Sales Co-Chairs: Orders tickets for the show and records sales.
- Quilter Info/Photo chair: Takes photos of members entered in the quilt show and pins paperwork on quilts on set-up day.
- Signs Chair: Puts up and takes down all the outdoor signs located throughout the town directing people to the show.
- Voting Co-Chairs: Count votes on Saturday after the quilt show and pins ribbons on the winning quilts.
