


FEATURED QUILTING CIRCLE BITS AND PIECES

Bits & Pieces was organized in 2000 by two new SMQA Guild members. The group consists of twelve members, which include six from Mariposa and six from the Oakhurst/Coarsegold/North Fork area. Bits and Pieces originally met in each other's homes the first Wednesday of each month, but since the pandemic the group has been meeting at the schoolhouse in Ahwahnee Hills Regional Park.

B&P is very active! Each year they have a challenge which results in a quilt for some worthy organization. One year they made patriotic blocks to assemble into a Quilt of Valor. Another year they exchanged 6½" squares with a different color scheme each month. Those squares have been made into several quilts for Mountain Crisis Center in Mariposa.
