On January 4 we will be working on cuddle quilts. Bring your machines and sew and visit with friends. Betsy Ann and her crew work hard to get the kits ready. This is also a good way to practice quilting.

Mary Platz and her group will have a trunk show on February 1 and the next day a class to make a Wacky Divine Nine quilt. Mary has been quilting for 22 years and has a lot of knowledge to share. The class fee is \$35.00 plus \$8.00 for the pattern. Mary needs to order the patterns so contact her at the January meeting. You will need 2-½ yards of border fabric and then choose 9 fat quarters to go with the border fabric. This design goes together quickly.

On March 1 & 2 we have Cathie Hoover doing a lecture on quilts and wearable arts. She will ask for models. Her class will be Wild and Crazy Quilts. Class fee is \$35.00. She will offer an optional template set. Her quilts have rick rack and all sorts of different embellishments.

Cindy Wiens will return in April with a lecture called Solids Showcase. A workshop on Friday the 6th will be My Swedish Ex. It is very colorful. Several members requested her return. The class will be \$35.00 and \$9.00 for the pattern.

Fabrics from Natural Fibers

Natural fibers are made from plant, animal, and mineral sources. Natural fibers can be classified according to their origin.

Seed Fibers: the fibers collected from the seeds of various plants are known as seed fibers.

Leaf Fiber: Fibers collected from the cells of a leaf re known as leaf fibers, ex. Pina, banana, etc.

Bast Fiber: Fibers that are collected from the outer cell layers of the plant's stem. These fibers are used for durable yarn, fabric, packaging, and paper. Some examples are flax, jute, kenaf. industrial hemp, ramie, rattan, and vine fibers.

Stalk Fiber: Fibers from the stalks of plants, e.g. straws of wheat, rice, barley. Bamboo and straw.

Fruit Fiber: Fibers collected from the fruit of the plant, e.g., coconut fiber.

Ancient Sanskrit manuscript on hemp based paper. Hemp was a common fiber used in the production of "rag" based papers from about 100 BCE to 1850 AD. Sanskrit is considered a "lost" or forgotten language having lost favor sometime in the 12th Century AD. Sanskrit is associated with poetry, song and verse and is often associated with spiritual or religious writings. As a written language, the color of ink used indicates several key factors, for instance; red ink indicates new or additional information not present in the original text, yellow ink indicates deletions while all other text was written in basic black or brown inks
