There was no New Business. The meeting was adjourned at 6:38 p.m. followed by Show and Tell and a program by Anelie Belden.

FEATURED QUILTING CIRCLE FOOTLOOSE

Footloose - inspired by the song and movie has been known as the 'working' group. Started in 1999 by 4 still-working quilters, our group has grown to 15 members; 2 have moved away but pop-up on our monthly Zoom meetings. We also sew monthly at Bear Paw. What makes us special is the comradery, the sharing of ideas, educating one-another in quilting techniques, supporting each other and always laughter.

In 2014, we made the Community quilt donated to the Teddy Bear Fan Club; bear blocks, of course. We have challenged each other making bags, blocks we exchange, row and round robin quilts, landscape and Yosemite quilts, Cuddle quilts, and the quilted chairs raffled at the 2019 Quilt Show. We take road trips to quilt shows and trade white-gloving for selling Opportunity Quilt raffle tickets. We picnic at Bass Lake, once in a Pontoon Boat during an electrical storm! When Covid broke out we made masks for hospitals, family and friends. Our annual Christmas pot luck parties are a blast.

Footloose is active in supporting the guild by serving on the Board, serving as Committee Chairs and working at SMQA's quilt shows. Did you know one of our members was one of SMQA's founders in 1980?

The Covid years have been hard on us; bits of us together on monthly sew days, bits of us on monthly Zoom meetings, but we're the greatest of friends and rejoice when together.

Available in a rainbow of colors, there are more than 100 types of roses, a symbol of devotion and love, and the various colors of roses carry their own meanings, from passionate love (red) to friendship (yellow).

You may not be as familiar with honeysuckle because honeysuckle flowers grow on shrubs or flowering vines and are not frequently used in bouquets. Honeysuckle flowers attract butterflies, so plant one in your yard (or the yard of someone with a June birthday) if you enjoy the colorful critters!

We have lots of information to share! To encourage Opportunity Quilt raffle ticket sales this year we will be holding two internal raffles:
