A great year in cuddle quilt donations along with all the other items. A total of 536 assorted items were made. Give yourselves a round of applause ladies!

Cuddle quilts, 154; wheelchair bags, 60; isolate covers, 6; heart pillows, 3; bibs, 24; scent hearts, 20 sets; belly bands, 50; pillowcases, 164; accessory bags, 29; sensory blankets, 26.

Items were donated to Veterans Home, Majestic Mountain Care Center, Helping Hands, Hines Hospice, Terry's House, Kases for Kids, Ryan's Cases for Smiles, Madera County Sheriff, Sierra Ambulance, and Mendota Farm Workers.

December donations were: Helping Hands, 24 bibs and 2 cuddle quilts and Kathy Burrow took 49 quilts to the Mendota Farm workers

Thanks to everyone who gave their time to make all these wonderful items for the Cuddle Quilt Program. And a big thanks to those ladies who helped make kits, donate finished items, sort fabric, write newsletter articles, and offer encouragement to those doing the work.

A prize will be awarded to the lady who donated the most cuddle quilts at our January meeting.

A special thank you from the Mendota Workers came through the individuals responsible for delivering the blankets thanking those who worked so hard to make those who received your quilts so loved this Christmas Season. Thank you on behalf of the Workers and their families.

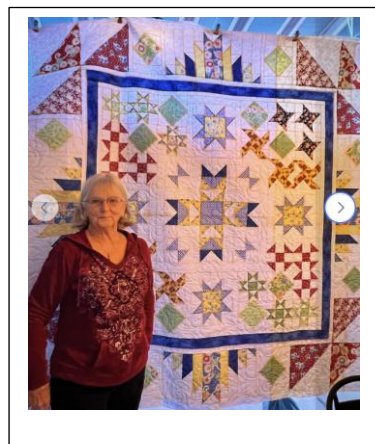
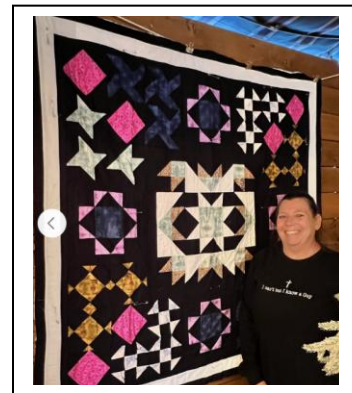
