Your work doesn't needs to be remarkable to be worth entering – having an interesting variety of quilts makes our show worth attending! For new or potential quilters, it's very encouraging to see simpler but still lovely quilts that seem more doable. If you are a new quilter or a first-time entrant, by all means mention it in the comments.

Sally Walker has set up an easy and efficient way to enter your quilt online, from our website, by clicking <a href="here">here</a>. If you aren't able to access the website, or find the process too daunting, perhaps you have a friend or family member who can give you a hand. Failing that, we have a couple of additional options for you:

- Call Sally and she will assist you by phone
- Stop by Bearpaw any Friday and Maria will enter it with you
- Call Bev Gulley (that's me) any day after April 2 and I will help
- Bring written information to the April general meeting. We will find a volunteer to enter it for you.

IMPORTANT – I've been told that in the past the quilt entry deadline was pushed out, usually more than once, in order to get enough entries for a great show. This year, that's NOT going to happen. We don't have much slack in the schedule so you need to take the April 7 date seriously. It's OK to enter a quilt that isn't finished, as long as it will be ready by the final turn-in day. Be sure to indicate priority in case we can't take them all. Quilt collection will be May 8 and May 15, from 9 AM to 1 PM at the Oakhurst Library community room.

Patty Cramer made a motion, Rhonda Dewey seconded, to accept the Feb. 2, 2023, minutes as printed in the newsletter. The motion carried.

The treasurer's report as published in the newsletter will be filed for audit.

Lynn Gray, First Vice President, announced she is taking photos tonight of members who are entering the quilt show. She presented programs and classes for the next four months:

Bev announced there will be no mystery quilt this year. Sinta Borland volunteered to set it up next year. This year we will have a UFO Challenge instead.

Charlotte Hickman, Newsletter, announced the deadline to send information for the April newsletter is the 15th. She also reported, thanks to sales of Donna's sewing supplies, there will be two \$600 scholarships available to local high school seniors. The deadline is quickly approaching.

Tricia Lacey, Cuddle Quilts, reported she has kits for cuddle quilts, pillow cases, bibs, and heart shaped pillows. She donated 9 isolette quilts and 50 belly bands to Valley Childrens Hospital. The next work day will be Thursday, March 23, at the library community room from 9:00 - 1:00. We'll cut out wheelchair bags.

Laura Donahue and Peter Gonzalez, Spring Retreat, encouraged members to sign up. The retreat will be April 12-15.

Quilt Show - Bev Gulley, reported we need volunteers to sign-up to sell tickets for our quilt and white glove at Best of the Valley in Lindsay on April 14-15.

Wendy Holt announced 23 quilts have been entered so far. She asked members to enter their quilts as early as possible. The final deadline is April 7. There will be no extensions. If members need help entering online they may call Sally Walker or visit Maria at Bear Paw on Fridays.

Rhonda Dewey reported May 8 and 15 are turn-in days for quilts at the Library community room from 9:00 - 1:00. Kay Marshall reported quilts must have a 4" sleeve (not minis and wall hangings).

Membership, Teri De la Torre announced there are 27 members in attendance. One new member joined tonight, Tammi Civello. We now have 80 members. We will receive a member roster online in May. Winners in the drawing were Helen Ramsey, Ruth Conner, and PJ Grant.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:42 p.m. followed by show and tell and game night.

## OPPORTUNITY QUILT UPDATE

Kay Marshall Quilt Ticket Chairman

At the March Quilt Show Meeting our treasurer, Joan Earnest, looked up the amounts which SMQA has earned selling tickets for our Opportunity Quilts for about the past 6 shows. The lowest amount which we brought in was about \$6,500. The highest amount was about \$9,000. I think we averaged about \$7,000+ earned on every quilt. On our current quilt so far we have brought in \$4,376. Less money earned means less we can spend on guest speakers, rent on the Community Center Pavillion for our meetings, etc. With our show dates of May 20 & 21, the last dates to sell tickets, we are definitely hurting. You may pick up tickets or turn in your stubs (with the accompanying money) to Kay Marshall at our monthly meetings, or you may pick up tickets or drop off your stubs and money at Bear Paw. A few people have mailed in their stubs and money (checks made out to SMQA) to our P.O. Box 1359, Oakhurst, CA 93644. Joan Earnest and Kay Marshall work together to make that acceptable too.

### **Quilt Collectors Needed**

Two quilt collectors are still needed for the quilt show. This really is the best job! Collectors will work in groups of two as the quilts are taken down, fold them neatly and take them to the stage. At the stage the quilts will be organized so they can be handed back to the owners at the end of the show. ### **BUY MORE FABRIC!**

Yes! You have permission to buy more fabric! Well, not quite. This is just a suggestion to buy a bit more so you don't run out.

Have you ever run out of fabric you are using in the middle of a project? Then you find the bolt is no longer in the store since someone else had the same taste as you.

So, when buying fabric, purchase between a quarter and half yard extra. Call it insurance. But you will feel better knowing that you won't need to frantically search for fabric in the middle of a quilting project. Any extra yardage will go into the stash for any future endeavor.

# Taking the Dye Out - May 5, 2023 With Colleen Pelfrey

She then teaches a variety of techniques for using DeColourant on fabric and demonstrates how to use all the different tools she has acquired. Panels are an option to use as a base and expand in size. In most cases you will know the person and be able to personalize it for them. Let's do what we can to help our men and women feel appreciated. They have given so much and need to know that the American people do care and are thankful to them. Please let me know when you decide to participate as our meeting time will dictate how many Veterans we can honor at the meeting.
