Sierra Mountain Quilters Association General Membership Meeting Minutes January 7, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 6:03 p.m. by President Penni Simily. There were 32 members present on Zoom. Penni welcomed the members along with new member, Barbara Messner.

Laura Gonzalez made a motion, seconded by Wendy Holt, to accept the December 3, 2020, minutes as printed in the Newsletter, with a correction to reflect that the Mystery Quilt pattern is available on the website. The motion carried. The December Treasurer's Report was accepted as published in the January newsletter and filed for audit.

Patty Cramer and Maria Ciccarelli, 2nd Vice Presidents, explained the heart pillows project for post-operative heart surgery and breast cancer patients at St. Agnes Hospital. Kits and completed pillows can be picked up and dropped off at Bear Paw Quilts, along with cuddle quilts. Members stuffed the pillows during this meeting. Patty and Maria are working on program planning.

Laura Gonzalez, 1st Vice President, stated the Material Girlfriends will give a presentation at the February 4th meeting on "Overcoming Quilting Disasters." They will do a workshop via Zoom on February 5th and 6th, 2021, on Confetti Hunter Star. The pattern is available at Bear Paw Quilts. Linda Wagner will give a presentation at the March 4, 2021, meeting on edgings, borders, and bindings.

Penni Simily advised of the Bear Paw Quilts Row Quilt project. The pattern book and kits are available at Bear Paw Quilts.

For Membership, Teri De La Torre requested that members fill out the membership form and turn in their money as soon as possible to be included in the membership directory. Sally Walker/Mystery Quilt-Webmaster, noted the mystery quilt information is available on the website, and she advised of the password for the site. Betsy Anne Youngholm noted that items for the newsletter, need to be submitted by the 20th of each month for inclusion in the newsletter. Patty Cramer provided a reminder that cuddle quilt kits are available to be picked up at Bear Paw Quilts. Someone will be available to collect the completed quilts on the second Friday of each month between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. Kathy Millhollon asked that members that have not picked up their raffle tickets for the opportunity quilt, to please do so and to sell them. The tickets are available at Sinta Borland's office. Kathy noted that \$1,954 has been raised thus far. The guilt will be raffled on May 16, 2021.

The appointed Board members were introduced: Teri De La Tore, Membership; Betsy Anne Youngholm, Newsletter; Sinta Borland and Jeri Carney, Quilt Show Co-Chairs; and Sally Walker, Webmaster. Motion was offered by Nancy Mason, seconded by Becky Smith, to approve the appointments. The motion carried.

Constance Peterson, Librarian, stated she will put information in the newsletter regarding the library and books that are available. Sally Walker stated she could put the titles on the website. Betsy Anne Youngholm noted that Helen Ramsey is in the process of downsizing and has a Bernina 700 for sale. Wendy Holt noted that the audit was completed and there were no issues. She thanked Becky Smith and Kay Marshall for being on the Audit Committee.

Show and Tell was held.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:30 p.m. The next meeting will be held via Zoom on February 4, 2021. Sign on is at 5:30 p.m. with the meeting beginning at 6:00 p.m.

These can also be found by going to our website, then clicking on the "member page" found on the horizontal navigation bar. I've said it before and I'll say it again, value is especially important in most mystery quilts, and this one is no exception!

Below is my first attempt at pulling out medium value fabrics for this mystery quilt. Though I was satisfied with my color choices, I decided to look at the black and white version of the picture I'd taken. Can you see that one fabric screams "dark" in comparison to the rest of my fabrics? The cute blue giraffe fabric didn't make the cut. Value is very important in this quilt. Taking a black and white photo of your fabrics will take the guesswork out of the selection process!
