CUDDLE CORNER

Thank you from Hinds Hospice:

...[I] just wanted to pass along a note regarding one of the quilts you kindly shared with me. I facilitated a memory making activity with a family recently. All the children and grandchildren were there. While everyone participated in putting their handprints on a canvas along with the handprint of the patient, the wife of the patient was inside the house just observing. It was too upsetting for her to participate. She has had multiple losses and is struggling with anticipatory grief. I offered her one of the quilts, which just happened to have the colors that the adult children and grandchildren were using,

When I gave it to her, she embraced it as a child embraces his or her favorite blanket. In a way, she found comfort holding on to it. I explained that it came from volunteers in the community and that the quilts were made with the intention of sharing support to someone in need.

She said. "Tell them that their support has reached me." She cried as she held the quilt.

I wanted to share this and take the opportunity to tell the quilt donors that one of their quilts provided comfort to a woman who is losing her husband of 40 years.

VIRTUAL MEETINGS

It has been difficult for us all to adjust to having such limited in-person contact. We miss seeing friends and family, giving and getting hugs, cutting and piecing and having lazy conversations together around a table.

In the meantime, the business of the SMQA continues. We will be voting on the proposed slate of officers at the November meeting and the proposed 2021 budget at the December meeting.

Your voice is important. We recognize that Zoom meetings are a poor substitute for our usual meetings. They are, however, what we have at this point. Our by-laws state that in order to transact business, "the **quorum** for a general business meeting will consist of at least one-third of eligible, voting members." With 105 members, that means we need at least 35 members in virtual attendance at every meeting.

It is especially important, if we are not able to have our show next year, to sell the Opportunity Quilt raffle tickets. This is still our major fundraiser.



We all need to do our part in this effort. To date, however, more than three-quarters of our membership (85 people) have either not picked up their tickets or have not turned in money for the tickets they have picked up. Current sales of \$1,734.00 is well below our projected income for this year.

It has been a different environment this year, without the usual venues to show our quilt and make raffle ticket sales. **Please** pick up your tickets and turn in your money.
