General Meeting, February 5, 2015

President Kathy Millhollon called the meeting to order at 6 pm at the Oakhurst Community Center. Kathy welcomed everyone and led the flag salute. Kathy wished a Happy Birthday to everyone with a birthday in February. She also thanked them for bringing refreshments for the meeting. Two new members were welcomed.

Gene Pennington from the San Joaquin Woodworkers was introduced. He gave an overview of their organization. He talked about the toys and cradles the woodworkers make for donation to needy children. This past year SMQA donated 60 mattresses and 60 pillows and 150 quilts for the cradles to the Woodworkers. Gene expressed the appreciation of the Woodworkers Association for SMQA donations and requested that more quilts, mattresses, and pillows for are required for 2015 projects. **Old Business**

Kathy reported that the 2014 Audit was completed and that all Financial Records were in order. The group made the following recommendations: timely submittal of check request and members pay for newsletter postage, if mailed.

The By Laws and Policies & Procedures are due to be updated. Patty Spinelli, Lin Crow, Kathy Millhollon and Linda Pennington have volunteered to be on this committee. They will meet on February 24, 2015.

New Business/Reports

The Minutes for the January 8, 2015 were approved.

The Treasurer's Report was filed for audit.

Patty Spinelli passed out forms for members to enter their quilts in the 2015 SMQA Quilt Show. There will be a limit of two quilts per member unless space dictates room for additional quilts. Sally Walker requested an improvement in ticket sales for the Opportunity Quilt. We have \$3,600 in sales so far. We are slightly above the number of sales this time of the year as in 2013.

Betsy Blum reported on the up-coming Programs and Workshops.

Announcements

Patty Spinelli introduced a new 12"x12" challenge. It will be based on just one word. The first quilt will be "Friendship" and will be due at the April meeting. The next due dates are June, September, and December.

Kathy read a letter sent to the guild from a middle school teacher in Fresno. She is conducting an after school sewing class. A motion was made by Susan Campbell and seconded by Mary Roseling that SMQA donate fabric from Cuddle Quilts to the Kings Canyon's Creative Grizzlies. Motion passed unanimously.

Kathy presented a book to SMQA donated by Lura Swartz for auction.

Judy Andes from Cuddle Quilts said she needed members to bring sewing machines to the March meeting. We will be making Cuddle Quilts. She also said she had kits for Wheel Chair Caddies and for Quilts. Members need to see Judy to take one home.

Diane Ward said she was collecting money for the upcoming retreat at ECCO. Jean Richter stated that books from the SMQA library were on the back table ready to be checked out. Meeting was adjourned at 6:35

"Word" Quilt Challenge

Make a 12" x 12" quilt of what the word 'Friendship' means to you or how you would describe the word in a quilt. In April you will receive the next word. We will be making four 12" x 12" Quilts.

The due dates are the meeting days in April, June, September, and December.

Mystery Quilt 2015

Not familiar with a "mystery quilt"?Here's how it works: As you begin, the finished pattern/design is unknown. After a member is signed up and paid, Chris Hudson will purchase a complete pattern for each person. The first "clue" (construction steps) will provide you with fabric requirements and cutting instructions. A new clue is provided each month at our regularly scheduled guild meetings--just enough to keep you guessing! In October or November you will receive the final construction steps and the 'mystery' will he reuealed. These with a finished top (not

be revealed. Those with a finished top (not necessary to have it quilted at this point) are asked to share with everyone at the December Christmas party.

This year's pattern is "Just Around The Bend" by Debbie Caffrey.

Finished size: Lap/Twin (or larger by adding borders).

Fabrics required: 3 (usually high contrast).

Skill level: 2 - challenges such as partial seaming, on point settings, more fabrics. Number of possible settings: 11. Cost: \$6.50.

For the Love of Quilting

It's been quite a love affair! The Sierra Mountain Quilters Association has shown its love for quilting with quilt shows for 31 years! The 2015 Show will make it 32 years. How did this romance begin?

From the Program for the 1983 Quilt Show, For the Love of Quilting:

"During the summer of 1981, Judy Crawford, Marge Hoyt, and Betsy Blum expressed a desire to start a Quilt Association in Oakhurst. With this desire, an organizational meeting was held Oct. 18, 1981 in the Oakhurst Fabric House classroom. Nineteen first women attended this organizational meeting, elected officers and set the meeting nights as the 1st and 3rd Thursday of the month at the Sierra Telephone Bldg. At the time that the quilt association was begun, publicity stated that 'the only requirement for membership is a love of quilting.' Since 1981, the Association has made three group quilts, had several speakers and demonstrators - among them Roberta Horton, and participated in community events, such as the MADDS festival. Association The now has а membership of 50, meets at 7 pm on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of the month at Yosemite High School, and is thrilled to be presenting our FIRST **QUILT SHOW!!"**

On **June 13th & 14th** of this year, SMQA will be holding its 20th quilt show, *Sierra Blooms*. Quilt shows and the raffle of opportunity quilts are the only fund-raising activities of SMQA. Proceeds support programs, room rental, insurance, amenities, and charitable work of the association. This is why it is vital that all members make a sincere effort to support the sales of raffle tickets. Without these sales, we

Quilt shows allow SMQA to present the art of quilting to the community and honor the hard work of its members. The quilts in SMQA shows are submitted by members with all levels of quilting experience. Even children have had quilts displayed in SMQA shows! SMQA members are especially happy to see quilts submitted by new members. The last show, in 2013 had over 90 quilts on display and close to 400 visitors.

Let's keep the love affair flourishing! Pick one or two of your favorite quilts and submit them to the 2015 show!

Cradle Presented to SMQA

A representative of San Joaquin Fine Woodworkers' Association (SJFWA), Gene Pennington, presented a doll cradle to SMQA.

The home location of SJFWA members extends from Porterville to Mariposa. Some of the members construct fine furniture; others turn wood into art objects such as bowls, even pens. Many of the members Gene called "Elves" transform slabs of wood into all wood toys that are given to less fortunate children at Christmas.

One of the toys constructed is a doll cradle which includes a quilt, mattress, pillow and a doll. In 2014 SMQA created 150 quilts, 60 mattresses and 60 pillows. Five other quilt guilds added 350 more quilts and 440 additional mattresses and pillows. These generous donations allowed the woodworkers to donate 500 completed cradle sets. They also donated 3,000 other wood toys.

To show appreciation for SMQA's efforts Gene presented to the

guild on behalf of SJFWA a cradle, quilt, mattress and pillow with a stuffed toy in addition to a doll stroller and cutting board made of maple and walnut.

Gene requested that we continue our generous quilting efforts during the balance of 2015 to produce sets of one each cradle quilt, mattress and pillow.

So, Ladies, get out those scraps or left over blocks you've been saving and start sewing! These are quick and easy to create. Please bring your finished items to our monthly meeting. Linda Pennington will collect the completed items and pass them on to the Woodworkers.

Instructions for Cradle Quilt, Mattress & Pillow:

All fabrics must be washable

Finished sizes:Cradle Quilt:16" to 18" squareCradle Pillow:4" x 5-1/2"Cradle Mattress:5-1/2" x 16"

You may make the quilt pillow case style or with a binding. Matching sets are preferred however the mattress and pillow can be made from muslin and stuffed with polyester stuffing, flannel, or batting.
