Two of our members have been asked to talk about how to choose a quilting design for your quilt depending on your quilt block pattern. For our May meeting we have our own talented quilters Dianne Matthews and Mary Brand that will do a presentation, "Why we quilt the way we do".

Mary Brand has been teaching many of us how to quilt using rulers; Diane Matthews does longarm free motion quilting. Both will share their ideas on choosing a quilting design for your quilt.

SMQA Donna Henning Memorial Scholarship Winner

Every year Sierra Mountain Quilters Association sets aside a scholarship for a deserving high school senior to promote sewing creativity and unique designs in wearable and quilting arts. This year we were fortunate to have four applicants, from Mariposa County HS, from Yosemite HS and from Glacier/Endeavor Charter HS.

The applicant chosen to receive the \$600.00 award is Jacqueline Ford, a student at Glacier/Endeavor Charter High School. Jacqueline plans to attend Fresno City College to receive an Associate Degree in business and art, and then transfer to Fresno State to pursue a bachelor's degree in fashion and design. Quoting from her application narrative, Jacqueline stated:

"When I graduate, I plan to either start my own business selling art, jewelry, and clothing; become an apprentice to a jeweler and then eventually start my own business; or go into fashion design and work for a fashion company. In order to become a successful artist who can make and sell her own goods, I need to know both art and business to be successful. I have seen many adults in my life work at a job they're dispassionate about, and I want to be passionate about what I work for."

Congratulations to Jacqueline Ford. Perhaps we will see her designs in stores someday.

Sierra Mountain Quilters Association General Membership Meeting Minutes April 1, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Penni Simily. There were 28 members present on Zoom. Penni welcomed the members and new members: Faith Moore, Sandy Eigenman and Jenny Schwabe.

Charlotte Hickman made a motion, seconded by Laura Gonzalez, to accept the March 4, 2021, minutes as printed in the Newsletter. The motion carried. The February Treasurer's Report was accepted as published in the April newsletter and filed for audit.

Laura Gonzalez, First Vice President, announced that Rachel Clark will give a presentation on Seminole piecing in October; John Egbert will do a workshop on the Grand Convergence quilt in November; and a scavenger hunt will be held tonight. Patty Cramer and Maria Ciccarelli, Second Vice Presidents, promoted the positivity challenge: a 16-inch block or smaller depicting something positive from 2020, and due in August.

Teri De La Torre, Membership reported that membership cards are available at Bear Paw Quilts and that ECCO may allow the fall retreat scheduled for September 13-16, 2021. Raffle drawings were held. There are 90 paid members currently. Betsy Anne Youngholm said the membership book will not be printed this year; a spreadsheet will be emailed with returning members and any changes, and with new members, to go with the 2020 book. Sally Walker, Webmaster and Mystery Quilt, said the password will be changed to the website and an email will be sent. She also asked that if members want to change their photograph on the roster to please send her the new one. The Mystery Quilt information is on the website and members are encouraged to participate, at no cost.

Patty Cramer, Second Vice President, provided an update on the distribution of charity quilts and heart pillows. She advised of a new project for belly bands for premature babies. They will work on putting together more kits and she thanked those who have assisted. A drawing was held from the names of those who have turned in charity items.

Maria Ciccarelli announced that Bear Paw will hold a sew along in October for Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Kathy Millhollon commented on the status of ticket sales for the opportunity quilt and encouraged members to continue with selling tickets.

Wendy Holt, Treasurer, thanked Charlotte Hickman for working with the schools on the Donna Henning Memorial Scholarship program. Charlotte reviewed the applications that were received and noted the Board selected Jacqueline Ford.

Show and Tell was held, and the scavenger hunt was held.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:37 p.m. The next meeting will be held via Zoom on May 6, 2021. Sign on is at 5:30 p.m. with the meeting beginning at 6:00 p.m.

Looking Forward (or back)



The "Baptist Fan" quilting design was named because it was used for quilting bees in the basement of churches. The sweeping fans were quickly quilted because they were easy to quilt when sitting around a quilt frame. They also follow the natural movement of your arm; each person did the section in front of them, then the quilt was rolled, and a new section appeared.

This design was also known as "elbow quilting" because the size of the fan was the reach between your elbow and your fingers. A free form fan design is easy to mark and to quilt, either by machine or by hand.


